- The applicant must be a citizen of the United States, a resident of New Jersey; able to read, write, and speak the English language; be sound in body and health; be of good moral character and have not been convicted of any criminal offense involving moral turpitude; possess an Associate's Degree or 60+ credits in a matriculated program from an accredited college; possess a valid New Jersey drivers license, and undergo written testing, drug screening, psychological testing, and oral interviews. Residency preference will be applied to the process.
- Excellent benefit package includes paid medical, dental, eyeglass, and prescription, personal days, sick days/year, holidays.
- The position involves shift-work, and demands good judgment, courage, physical fitness and skills, fairness, empathy, and a commitment to the community for which we work.
